Preschool Enrollment Opens March 1

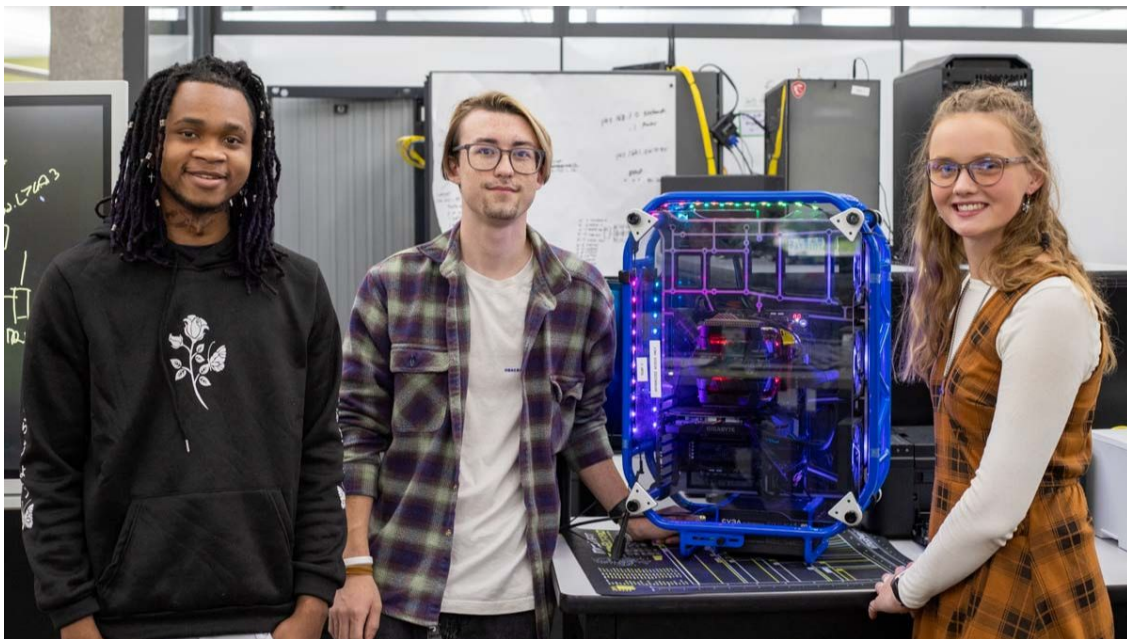
