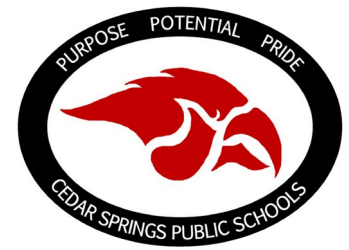

Great Start Readiness Program

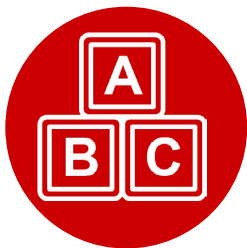
